Key steps in social -health policies

•Law No 180 of 13 May 1978 "Voluntary and Compulsory Health Assessments and Treatment" - The Basaglia Law, from custody/control to treatments

«In order to really be able to deal with "illness", we should be able to encounter it outside institutions meaning not not only outside the psychiatric institution, but outside any other institution whose function is to label, codify and fix in frozen roles those who belong to it»

•Projects Objective 1994- 96 and 1998-2000: definition of the organisational structure and standards of mental health services →The establishment of the Department of Mental Health (DSM): DSM is the set of facilities and services which function is to take care of the demand for mental health care, assistance and protection within the territory as defined by the local health authority (ASL).

•Law 328/2000, "Framework law for an integrated system of interventions and social services" \rightarrow the idea of health as a combination of psychological, physical and social well-being is upheld \rightarrow the interconnection of people's needs is recognised, and hence the need for collaboration between all the institutions that promote and protect his well-being. \rightarrow special attention to the involvement of the third sector

Constitutional Law 3/2001 → Regional Decentralisation

Granting greater legislative autonomy to the regions on many matters including health protection \rightarrow This reform, for economic, management and political reasons, has generated strong regional differentiation and several inequalities in health protection






Mental health expenditure by Region. % of Regional Health Fund (2020).

In 2021, the number of adult users of public mental health services in Italy is around 800,000 (\rightarrow 61,177 in Lazio)

Solaris : a place of resistance

Solaris is a non-profit organization. It was founded in June 2002 by a group of family members of patients who were placed in temporary residential mental health services in Rome.

The organization promoted an innovative program with the help of volunteers and mental health professionals from the Department of Mental Health of the Local Health Authority (now called ASL Roma 1): it was mobilized to offer users the opportunity of living independently in their own homes, supporting them in this housing autonomy project

→ In this context was launched one of the first "supported housing" experiments in Italy, called "Le Chiavi di Casa"(The House Keys).







The supported housing



Mental health professionals and volunteers support users in daily activities, in their relationships with flat mates and relatives, increasing their autonomy.


→ Domiciliary assistance is flexible and adaptable to personal needs which change over time.



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


Currently Solaris OdV has 40 associate members and 18 volunteers who provide their skills and support to implement housing and social inclusion projects for people with mental distress





Throughout the Asl Roma 1 territory, 160 users of mental health services are involved in supported living projects









But living in one's own home is not enough

- It is important that users are supported in strengthening their socialisation skills, forging relationships with the local community, developing interests and skills and finding a job if possible.
- → Focusing on the users' desires, interests and needs, they were involved in integrated workshops in which participation was immediately opened up to family members, mental health workers, volunteers, and people from the neighbourhood who, around a common interest (writing, computing, photography, music, etc.), found a shared space for a peer-to-peer interaction and enrichment
- → Since 2002, workshops have multiplied and more and more attention has been paid to the participation of users with specific skills as tutors or experts in many workshop activities, in line with the **peer tutoring strategy**.

Counseling desk:

Legal assistance for support administrators: a legal advice desk to provide users and their families with free, professional and personalised advice.


Information desk for 'Dopo di Noi' (After Us): a group of volunteers, both from Solaris OdV and Scalea 93 (non-profit organisation), are at the disposal of family members to provide information and updates on national and regional legislation.

Listening/ support desk for relatives of people with psychiatric distress: held on Wednesday mornings by a volunteer expert psychologist.





Training



Solaris organises courses aimed at professionals, family members and volunteers working in the care of psychiatric services users to equip them with tools to help them face the complexity of everyday life.

The courses run annually and have partnerships with other associations, such as Apeiron and Tininiska.

The focus on comparing and sharing experiences is in line with the strategies of the mental health services of ASL Roma 1, which from several years organises multifamily psychoanalysis groups according to the model implemented in Argentina by Jorge García Badaracco.
